Sadly, Alison Chabloz was convicted on all charges today (25 May). The charges all related directly or indirectly to songs she had performed which were deemed to have been grossly offensive.

She has yet to be sentenced because the judge John Zani has called for a probation report. Alison will meet with the probation officer on 31 May and sentencing will be on 14 June at 10.00 at Marylebone Magistrates Court Zani did not read out his judgement in it entirety but I did get the chance to read his full judgement.

The full Judgment

Para 112 - near the end of this written judgement – ran

"Put shortly, this court is satisfied that the material in each of the songs is grossly offensive as judged by an open and multiracial society -as opposed to, for example, merely offensive."
